The President's Message

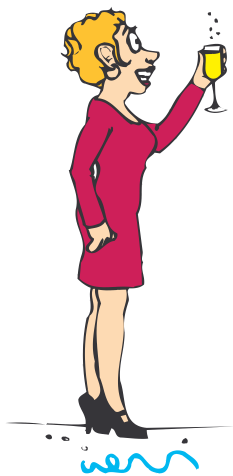

Black Cat Quilts, opened in 1996 by owner Gretchen Nelson, carries over 2,000 bolts of fabric in a broad selection of contemporaries, traditionals, batiks, Asian prints, hand-painted and hand-dyed fabrics, and novelty and juvenile prints. They have a good selection of batting and notions, and also carry a book collection from major publishers covering all areas of quilting. Gretchen and her knowledgeable staff are always available for assistance in making selections, from design questions to finishing details. Just ask!

Each year, Black Cat Quilts offers more than 200 classes taught by highly experienced, expert teachers (*including our own Marcella Peek!*). The schedule includes something for everyone—absolute beginners, kids, fairly new quilters, and experienced quilters. The upper walls are lined with gorgeous quilts that are samples of classes provided by the teachers, samples of patterns offered, and raffle quilts made by various Bay Area guilds.

Gretchen is a fourth-generation retailer whose family created Nelson Mercantile Company in Argyle, Wisconsin, a general store operated successively by her great-grandfather, grandfather, and father. Gretchen's mom, Jeannine Nelson, a devoted 25-year quilter, makes an annual six-week visit from Wisconsin and works every day at the Black Cat. Jeannine has a gift for helping customers with color coordination and fabric selection.

Gretchen started quilting in 1992 and fell in love with it. In '94 she felt she needed a more creative, fun and engaging career than providing marketing services in the environmental engineering field, and using her MBA began researching and planning her quilt store.

In business for eleven years, she's very happy with her choice. We asked what Gretchen liked best about her business, and she said, "I love all the people I meet, and working with them. As a customer once told me, 'This is more than just a store, it's a community.'"

Gretchen's concern? "Getting people to understand that it's easy to get here!" Black Cat is located at the southern end of SF, so it's an easy find for our San Mateo County quilters. Take 280 to 19th Avenue, 19th to Ocean Avenue; hang a right on Ocean and it's just a scant 2 blocks away on the left-hand side (just a few blocks north of Stonestown Galleria).

Once you stop by, you'll wonder what took you so long! □

Announcements: Marcella Peek said that due to a printing error in the 2008 Guild Roster, pages 3 and 4 were identical. The information that should be on page 3 has been reprinted as "stick-on" pages, and are available on the membership table. • Marcella announced that a clipboard was being sent around for those interested in signing up to form an Auction Committee. At present there is no auction coordinator, no committee and subsequently, no auction planned until someone steps up to the plate.

Mission Statement: Our mission is to promote the Peninsula Quilters' Guild and its activities. Our focus is to enhance the enjoyment of all members and educate the public about quilting. We will provide a venue for guild members to display their quilts, and will provide fund-raising opportunities for the Guild's operating budget.

I need your help! I have gotten so excited about the Quilt Show Boutique that I've been making item after item. I finish one thing and think, "What can I make next?" Someone better stop me or there will be nothing left for anyone else to make.

This year, we have decided to limit our merchandise to those things that sold well or reasonably well at our last quilt show and, maybe, a few things we think should sell. Further, we will be limiting the number of each item so that we don't get too many of any one thing. At the December meeting, I asked all of you to start signing up to make specific items so that we will have a good idea of what to expect. I will have the sign up sheets at the meetings, so come see me during the breaks. We are looking for things like placemats, tote bags, napkins, eyeglass/camera/cell phone cases, pincushions, aprons, juvenile quilts, and juvenile pillow cases among other items.

Look at your scraps and your orphan blocks as a starting point. A 6¹/₂" orphan block magically becomes a potholder when you put some Teflon backing and binding on it. Likewise, a 9" or 12" orphan block becomes a trivet by adding the Teflon and binding. There is such a satisfying feeling from using some of those pesky scraps. Try it! You'll like it. **And** you won't have to spend any money to make something wonderful!

We will have two, maybe three, workshops where we can get together to make things for the boutique and we will sew, talk, and laugh. Stay tuned!

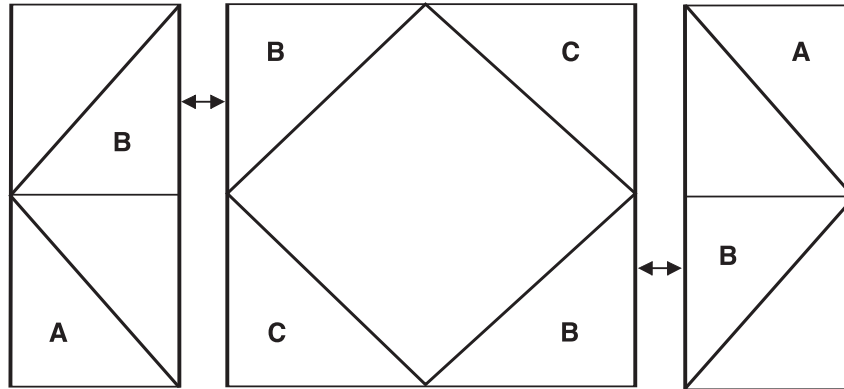

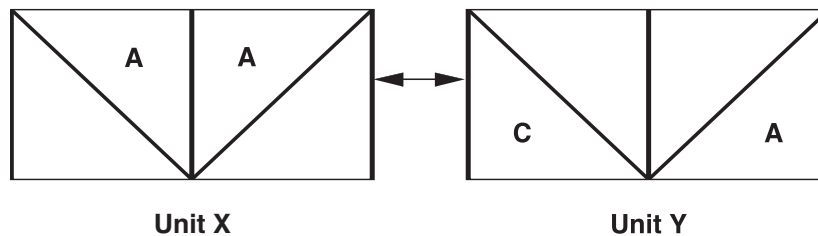
Mystery Quilt Part 4 of 4

Take 2 unit Z's and sew one to each side of a focus fabric unit, matching fabrics B as per diagram.



Press seam allowances to Unit Z.

Sew each unit X to a unit Y as per diagram.



Press seam allowances OPEN.

Take one of these strips and sew to top of focus fabric unit, matching fabric C.

Take another strip and flip it upside down and sew to bottom of focus fabric, matching Fabric C.

You will have 20 blocks each measuring 12 1/2" (including seam allowances).

Arrange and sew blocks in rows of 4 blocks by 5 rows.
