Then, an entire army of volunteers brought it all together for the big night. I was heartened to see so many people show up to the Garden Center with their sleeves rolled up, ready to tackle any job. It was just a remarkable site to see everybody do all this heavy lifting for our beloved guild. The net result was not only an astounding amount for our coffers but an evening where we all came together to enjoy each other's company, while sipping sparkling wine and going home with armloads of quilting goodies.

In retrospect, I have sincerely enjoyed serving as your president these past 12 months. It has been my privilege to work with such dedicated, passionate and talented guild members. Peninsula Quilters Board Meeting Aug. 6, 2025

Attendees: Nancy Krosse, Carol Blitzer, Terry Caselton, Holly Colgan, Jean Dail, Barbara Hall, Harriet Hirsch, Sandy Kelly, Barbara Mattson, Michele Parry, Jena Walter, Cynthia Yin and Brenda Ziegler.

The meeting was called to order at 10:01 a.m.

President (Nancy Krosse) received a motion from Michele Parry and a second from Carol Blitzer to approve the July board meeting minutes. This was passed by those present. There was a discussion regarding the reporting of financial data in the meeting minutes. Current procedure will be updated for clarification to specify that dollar amounts of dues and event earnings can be included but data on bank account positions should not be included. Also, any large donations or sponsorships should be acknowledged, but monetary value and donor should be anonymous unless requested by the donor. Michele Parry agreed to the suggestion that this be added to the Standing Rules for the next roster print run.

Fundraising (Sandy Kelly) spoke about the Auction being held at the August General Meeting. She said there are 27-28 items that will be auctioned live and that there are many items on the silent auction. The doors will open at 6 p.m. A Blast will go out. There will be five cashiers, and they will be able to accept cash, checks or credit cards.

Vice President (Barbara Mattson) informed us that there are still two board positions open: VP & Parliamentarian. Quilter of the Year ballots will be available at the meeting. This will also be

the last day to vote. A Blast will go out regarding the open positions. Michele Parry spoke about the Parliamentarian position as sounding, but not being, overwhelming and offered to mentor.

Treasurer (Jean Dail) reported that we have healthy bank accounts. Receipts came in for workshops, and our insurance went down since we no longer have the storage unit. She is working on a budget to be presented at the September meeting.

Corresponding Secretary (Terry Caselton) sent a condolence card to Nancy Krosse due to the loss of her brother. She sent Anne Merics a get-well card as well. She mentioned that Judith Paul may need help with the September birthday party.

Membership (Cynthia Yin) has already received a few dues payments for the next fiscal year, and she will be sending out a Blast regarding the fee and scheduling.

Outreach (Barb Hall) reported that she is taking over the set-up for the Burlingame scrappy bee, which will now be called Bee Charitable. It was requested that Bee Charitable be moved back into Outreach. Quilters will be able to work on their own charity quilts or on group projects. Nancy adjourned the meeting at 10:32 a.m.

PQ General Meeting Minutes August 20, 2025

Nancy Krosse called the meeting to order at 7 p.m.

The meeting was held at the San Mateo Garden Center but not offered this month on Zoom. President: Nancy Krosse, in order to save time for the planned auction that evening, reported for most board members. Nancy requested and received a motion to approve the July meeting minutes with the correction that Gale Green will not be teaching the March workshop. It will be held on March 19 with Michelle Trimble teaching "Stunning Improv Sunbursts." The motion to approve the minutes with the correction was made by Angi Merlone, seconded by Sandi Adger and approved by the members present. The chair for the September Birthday Party has made the purchases required but due to a death in her family. Nancy is looking for volunteers to assist. Barbara Mattson wanted to announce that ballots for Quilter of the Year are available as is a red basket to drop them in. Tonight was the last chance to vote. Nancy reminded us that we still need a VP for the next fiscal year. The Hospitality and Parliamentarian positions have been filled. On Jean Dail's behalf, Nancy reported that we have healthy bank accounts and that dues are due in September. Last month we were over on expenses by less than \$300. For Jess Millikan, Nancy informed us that the next Free Table will be held Saturday, Sept. 27, which is after the September meeting. Donations can be brought to the September meeting or dropped off at Jess' house. Nancy showed a sample of a pillow made for the "Wreath-o-Rama Houses block pillow" class to be given by Tina Curran on Oct. 16.

Challenge Quilt: Sue McCollum stepped in to show two samples of quilts that fulfill the Fall Challenge. The entries are due at next month's General Meeting. Please bring your paint chip with you. Quilts should use colors from these chips with addition of one solid black, gray, white or cream only. Quilts will be hung and judged at the meeting. Quilts do not need a sleeve for the meeting but will need one if entered in the San Mateo County Fair.

President: Nancy Krosse also announced that Barb Hall had a kit ready if one of her long-arm quilters would like to take it. She checked with Membership who tallied 71 members and 5 guests present.

Show & Tell: Carlie Peck took photos of the Show and Tell quilts for submittal to the newsletter. Nell Lee Stinson (kaleidoscope quilt from Pernille Gutschick's class), Annette Caves (crocheted blankets), Carlie Peck (Grand Canyon modern quilt), Lorraine Twomey (red, white & blue quilt). The meeting was adjourned at 7:17 AM.
