Her title is "Maker Unknown (Possibly a Seamstress)," and the presentation is an exploration inspired by historical quilts and the imagined lives of their unknown makers.

September Challenge: Transitions

The September challenge has three parts.

- A fabric challenge. (It's green, of course.) You must use a recognizable amount of the challenge fabric somewhere on the front of your quilt (binding is OK).
- A thematic challenge. Your quilt must show a transition. It can be a pieced quilt with a transition of shape, color or size. Or it can be an art quilt showing a transition of some sort – a change of seasons, or a caterpillar/butterfly, a graduation, or a wedding or a baby, for just a few examples.
- A technical challenge. Your quilt may not be a square or a rectangle with straight edges. So: It can be a shape that isn't a square or rectangle, OR it can be a square or rectangle with a broken edge (mini-me, anyone?) or a complex edge (scallops, prairie points)
 - (mini-me, anyone?) or a complex edge (scallops, prairie points, apple cores, or hexies, for example).



- Quilts delivered to Jess Millikan by **Sept. 3.** (Or contact me and I'll pick up your quilt from you). I'll handle photographing for the on-line slide show, and members will be able to vote electronically or in person.
- Deadline for electronic voting for those unable to attend the September meeting: Sept.
 16.
- Quilts displayed and winners selected at the General Meeting: Sept. 18.

You'll vote for your favorite quilts, considering creativity, workmanship, compliance with the challenge rules, and anything else that inspires you.

All entrants will receive a "Wanda Ribbon," but this time that will mean the first three places will get ribbons designed and made by the ribbon-master herself; everyone else will get ribbons constructed by me and Guild volunteers with Wanda's guidance. I have a number of volunteers already, but if you want to be added to the list, let me know. Once I see how many ribbons we need, I'll have a better idea how many volunteers can be helpful. The first, second and third place finishers will receive goodie bags and gift certificates with a \$20 discount for the PQ Workshop of their choice.



Peninsula Quilters Board Meeting Aug. 7, 2024

The meeting was called to order at 10:00 a.m.

President (Sandy Kelly) opened the meeting with a request for a motion to approve the July board meeting minutes. The motion was made, seconded and approved by the members present. She announced that 17 people had already signed up for the April 2025 off-site retreat. Also, there are nominations for all board positions for next year except the Redwood City Library Case Coordinator. Please ask around for a volunteer. She'd like to have all positions filled in time to make the new roster.

Vice-President (Nancy Krosse) is waiting for more Quilter of the Year nominations and will request them at the next general meeting. Help is needed for the September Birthday Party. She will request that people send her a photo of themselves at age 5 or younger. There will be a contest to match photos to members. She needs help with the set-up.

Treasurer (Jean Dail) reviewed the draft of the 2024-25 budget. She rearranged some of the subcategories and showed detail and summary reports. The final report will be presented to the membership. The last two years PQ has run at a deficit, and that is expected to continue this year. Much discussion was generated. Questions included whether activities that are self-funded should go through the budget (retreats and Challenge Quilt for example), adjustment to expected membership revenue since Life Members do not pay the fee, should the cost of membership and workshops be adjusted for inflation, should non-members be charged more than they already are, should we consider spending down, how does any change affect the Standing Rules. It was noted that in the past, it was voted that workshops need to pay for themselves. This has been true but the cost for teachers has been going up. Sandy Kelly suggested that a fuller review of the categories should be made. Issues can be discussed after the general meeting. Any change requests need to be submitted by an Aug. 20 deadline. **Corresponding Secretary (Terry Caselton)** sent get well cards to Judy Ousterhout and Grace Hardy who are both doing well in recovery.

Membership (Anne Merics) reported that we have 153 members and one new member for the month.

Parliamentarian (Michele Parry) has formed a committee to review the Bylaws to determine if any updates are needed. Connie Bowles mentioned that Kathy Lanza should be removed from the list of Affiliates as she is closing her shop. New Bylaws will be ready in time for the next roster printing.

Fund Raising (Leonie Batkin) reported that at PIQF, 37 of the 40 slots were filled by only 27 volunteers. This meant that she spent a lot of time filling in. The Opportunity Quilt (OQ) raffle ticket sales at PIQF generated \$753, which was higher than last year. So far, the OQ has brought in \$953. As advertised, three names were pulled from the volunteers, and they will be reimbursed for the show registration. The winners were Dorothea Copeck-Nolan, Joyce Wheeler and Brenda Ziegler. The OQ was put in the newsletter and the website. A long discussion ensued regarding the need for volunteers in general and how to generate more interest and involvement. Some points brought up were volunteers cancelling, considering annual requirement for volunteering, approaches to encourage participation, is it worth the OQ costs (in money and time) to continue the OQ program. Sandy Kelly proposed that all the info be pulled together so the facts can be reviewed.

Alice's Love (Barb Hall) said that the recent Alice's Love event was the last one. The small funds left over are being donated to charity quilts.

Retreats (Jena Walters) reported that she and Barb Hall are making plans for a Fall Retreat via Zoom.

Sandy adjourned the meeting at 11:18 a.m.

Sandy Kelly called the meeting to order at 7:02 p.m.

The meeting was held at the San Mateo Garden Center and offered on Zoom.

President: Sandy Kelly welcomed new member Susan Viess. A motion was made to approve the July minutes and passed by the members present.

Programs – Speakers and Workshops: Jess Millikan gave an overview of the Nov. 16 Saturday wool felt embroidery workshop (10 students, no maximum) to be held via Zoom, and groups can share this Zoom workshop via "a watch party." The instructor will be Kathleen Riggins, and the title of the block to be made from Kathleen's quilt is "Eye Roll," a wool felt embroidery. Registration is due by Sept. 19. You can order a kit from Kathleen when you register, provide your own materials, or buy a kit from Jess and Sara Guyol for \$25 (since buying the thread and other materials needed is a substantial investment Jess and Sara will put together a kit to be used in the class). Jess encouraged everyone to look at Kathleen's unusual project on her website, which should be "loads of fun."

Correspondence: Terry Caselton sent a get-well card to Mavourneen Lopez because she had a second hip surgery.

By-Laws-Review Committee: Michele Parry reported that the committee has prepared a proposed revision of changes that will be presented for the group to read and be ready to vote on at the next meeting. Sandy reiterated the importance of reading the By-Laws to see if anything needs to be addressed or changed.

Quilter of the Year: Nancy Krosse passed out the nominations for Quilter of the Year to be voted on by the members tonight and online. Deadline for voting is Sept. 11.

Birthday Party: Nancy reported that at the Birthday Party on Sept. 18 the Quilter of the Year and Challenge quilt winners will be announced. There will be a buffet lunch and a lot of fun games. Nancy is requesting members to submit a scanned photo of when they were a toddler to: PQblasts@gmail.com by Sept. 11. Cynthia Yin will receive the photos and forward them to Brenda Ziegler. Nancy will send out a "blast" to all the members to submit their photos and give further information regarding the Birthday Party and Quilter of the Year award.

Treasurer: Jean Dail gave the year-to-date Oct 1 – Sept. 30 balances in the checking, savings and CD. She indicated the proposed budget will be presented to the members to be voted on. The budget was discussed and questions asked by the members. Sandy thanked Jean for all her hard work as the treasurer.

Email Blaster: Cynthia Yin has a flyer for the Lorraine Woodruff-Long Saturday Workshop – Free-form Curves Quilt Block Workshop - \$75 on Sept. 21, 2024, at the College of San Francisco Extension, register online.

President: Sandy reported there was one attendant on Zoom. Sandy also informed the members of Quilt Shows in various cities and the dates of each show. She has a flyer with the information if any member is interested.

Sandy also still needs a "lead" person for the Quilt Challenge. Jess Millikan has instructions. Talk to Jess if interested; a "lead" needs to volunteer by Oct. 1.

From Me to You, Round Two: Sandy reminded everyone to put their tickets in the baskets of prizes. During dessert tickets will be drawn till all the prizes are gone. Sandy as president wants to acknowledge all the wonderful members of the guild.

Announcements: Barbara Hall (Jena Walter) reported the next Zoom Retreat will be held on Oct. 4-6. Signups will be at the September meeting or email Barbara. Barbara also clarified the "Alice's Love" money was donated by Alice's family.

Social Media Contact: Carlie Peck thanked everyone for their quilt photos and for September wants "Cool Quilt Backs!"

Bee Coordinator: Mary Raftery wants to update the members in each "bee."

Membership: Justine Barnard reported there were 67 in attendance and one new member.

The meeting was adjourned at 8 p.m.


