Foundation Paper Piecing (FPP) is one of the best ways to ensure perfect points, create complex piecing designs and execute detailed pictorial designs. This pattern is written to have minimal fabric waste and is a good choice for beginning and intermediate quilters. During class we will also discuss using value and color to create a dimensional effect. A PDF version of the pattern is included with the workshop.

Peninsula Quilters Board Meeting Nov. 4, 2025

The meeting was called to order at 10:03 a.m.

President (Barbara Mattson) reviewed a correction to the October minutes requested by Holly Colgan. Holly's committee was incorrectly titled Activities and Education but should be Activities and Events. The minutes incorrectly stated that she asked for information for the new roster, but it was for the committee binder. A motion to approve the October minutes with these corrections was made by Cynthia Yin and seconded by Sandy Kelly. This was passed by those in attendance. Barbara informed us that she was contacted by a woman who offered vintage tablecloths that would make beautiful quilts and some Quilter's Newsletter magazines from the 1980s-90s. The Holiday Party team may be able to use them.

Treasurer (Jean Dail) reported low expenses as usual for October so revenue slightly outpaced costs. Nancy Krosse mentioned that she forwarded non-profit paperwork she received, and Jean confirmed that she got it. Jean is working on the audit and will ask for formation of an audit committee at this month's general meeting. She hopes to be able to submit the audit in December.

Corresponding Secretary (Terry Caselton) sent a sympathy card to Cindy Williamson. As the contact for PQ with the Northern California Quilt Council (NCQC), Terry asked Jean Dail to renew our membership.

Fund Raising (Nancy Krosse) discussed the pricing for a potential fundraiser at the Holiday party for a vintage quilt donated by Grace Hardy. Nancy also received a turquoise Singer machine from the mid 1950s. She will see if it is worth raffling.

Membership (Cynthia Yin) reported that we have 141 members and no new members last month. She was contacted by Laura McHugh about the San Mateo County Fair (SMCF). Cynthia will be the PQ liaison with Laura. She also gave us an update on the Giants Quilt that will be the 2025-26 Opportunity Quilt. It will be shown at some PQ meetings, the San Mateo Garden Center's Open House and at the SMCF. There was a discussion of the raffle ticket price.

In Person Event/Zoom Support (Sandy Kelly) and Cynthia Yin will be managing the audio/visual set up for this month's general meeting remote speaker. This is a hybrid system, which will allow us to have speakers from anywhere.

Outreach (Barb Hall) reminded us that the Charity Sewing in Burlingame will be held next Friday. Cynthia Yin will bring some kits and Sandy will have some placemat binding to be done. People can also work on their own charity items. Barb asked whether we wanted to consider planning a bus trip, perhaps to the Folsom Quilt Show. There was a discussion about how that could be handled. Terry Caselton offered to take on the research. After questioned, Barb confirmed that a Free Sew will be held after this month's general meeting.

Barbara adjourned the meeting at 11:41 a.m.

PQ General Meeting Minutes November 19, 2025

Barbara Mattson called the meeting to order at 9:32 a.m.

The meeting was held at the San Mateo Garden Center and offered on Zoom.

President: Barbara Mattson welcomed new member, Sarah Bekhit. There was a motion to approve the October minutes, which was seconded and passed by those present. Barbara informed us of a presentation of quilt art by May Gaspay and her son, Mik, being held at the Art Kiosk in Redwood City.

Treasurer: Jean Dail reported healthy bank balances and revenues coming in from workshops and new members.

Corresponding Secretary: Sandy Kelly, for Terry Caselton, said a condolence card was sent to Cindy Williamson who lost her partner.

Speakers: Sandy Kelly told us Heather Kojan would speak via Zoom on "Quilt Remix: UFOs, Orphan Blocks and What Was I Thinking??!! Fresh Ideas for Stale Projects."

Outreach: Barb Hall mentioned that we would have a Sew Day after the meeting. She also displayed some donated fabric, which was available to anyone. She asked us to hold off on giving her any more tops until she called for them again as all the long armers are busy quilting. She asked that submitted tops be approximately 60" x 80". (Upon subsequent review, size should be approximately 65" x 80".)

Workshops: Jess Millikan talked about the January and February workshops. In January, Polly Matsuoka will teach "Birds With Character: A Choose Your Own Adventure in Collage Quilting." She has five different designs of birds with personality available. In February, we will Honor Our Own with Gale Green, whose presentation is 'I'm Just a Regula Quilta!" For future workshops, please see the PQ website.

Holiday Party: Cathy Stillman requested holiday quilts to hang at the party. She needs five more volunteers to make centerpieces. There will be prizes. She welcomes donations. Grace Hardy has donated a beautiful antique quilt, which will be raffled off. Tickets are 2 for \$5 or 10 for \$10.

Membership: Cynthia Yin said there were 57 members present and 3 guests.




