If you are doing your own charity project, bring what you will need.


NOTE: Irons and ironing boards will be provided. Individual irons may not be used.

Peninsula Quilters Board Meeting June 7, 2023

Attendees: Sandy Kelly, Carol Blitzer, Connie Bowles, Terry Caselton, Julie Curry, Maggie Hardy, Suzanne Jeuck, Nancy Krosse, Sara Medina, Michele Parry, Jena Walter, Rose Wilson and Brenda Ziegler.

The meeting was called to order at 10:02 a.m.

President (Sandy Kelly) asked for approval of both April and May Board Minutes. Motion to do so was made, seconded and approved by all. She talked about having apprentices for some of the board positions in order to make transitions easier. Sandy will talk about it in the general meeting. It may also allow interested people to volunteer sooner. In the June general meeting, we will also look to generating a Nominating Committee for the 2023-24 fiscal year positions. She mentioned that the Recording Secretary calls the Nominating Committee's first meeting. Treasurer (Sara Medina) stated that total funds are down over the 2021-22 fiscal year due to additional monies being used for member activities during COVID. We had a loss of less than \$200 due to hackers' theft that was not recoverable. Sara has been working to clean up data and moving funds from Chase to the San Mateo Credit Union. All funds will be moved to SMCU by July 1. Jean Dail has been assisting Sara. Sara will not be present for the July general meeting and asked if Jean can present the Treasurer info on her behalf. There was a discussion on the budget preparation for approval of a budget in the September general meeting. Sara is expecting cost of living adjustments for many items due to the current economic situation. These items include workshops, speakers, travel, outreach, etc., which will need inflation adjustments. At the general meeting, input data will be requested and others will be contacted by June 20 with data to be supplied to Sara by June 30. The suggested timeline is to have all input by the July board meeting for development of a preliminary budget by August so that the proposed budget can be submitted to the membership at the September meeting. Connie requested that the appointed officers who have volunteers working with them be included in emails to the committee members so they are all kept in the loop. She also asked for a copy of the current budget, which Sara said she would supply by Monday.

Correspondence (Rose Wilson) sent a card to Michelle Graham who is experiencing a medical issue.

Parliamentarian (Michele Parry) had nothing to report but thanked Sara for all her work. **Programs (Connie Bowles)** had nothing to report. She had previously mentioned that the board is responsible for the birthday party.

Outreach (Julie Curry) had nothing to report.

Virtual Events (Jena Walters) apologized for the delay in coordinating the answers to the recent survey. It should be completed by the end of this week. She also requested an apprentice for hosting Zoom.

President (Sandy Kelly) proposed eliminating the \$5 charge to guests on their first visit to be more friendly and welcoming. There was a discussion involving several board members both for and against the change. Michelle Parry investigated and found that the guest charge was part of the Standing Rules. This means any change needs to be approved by the membership. Per Michele, in order to do that it needs to be published in the newsletter and put on the table for discussion in the next bylaws meeting. Sandy will continue to pay for her guests first visit to a guild meeting. Regarding Sandy's event during the August general meeting, she mentioned that the raffle includes donated sewing machines. Raffle tickets will be sold at the June, July and August meetings, and winners will be pulled at the August meeting. One Featherweight is being donated by Sandy and a second Featherweight is a donation from Loraine Strong's family.

PQ General Meeting Minutes June 21, 2023

Sandy Kelly called the meeting to order at 7:05 p.m. The meeting was held at the San Mateo Garden Center and offered on Zoom. She introduced four guests: Lorraine Twomey, Donna Williams, Sandy Tsushima and Marianne Camous. She also mentioned that raffle tickets are still available for the current Opportunity Quilt - the winning ticket will be pulled at the July meeting. Raffle tickets are also available for Raffle Baskets and for a special "From Me to You and a Little for the Guild" raffle. This raffle includes an embroidery machine and various donated items and will be completed in August. A motion was made to approve the May minutes, seconded and approved by the members present.

Finance: Sara Medina discussed the progress in the move to the San Mateo Credit Union. A preliminary budget will be available in July; after review, it will go to the board in August for final approval by the members in September. She said Jean Dail has been shadowing her,and they have been meeting regularly.

Fund Raising: Jess Millikan spoke about several issues.

Challenge: She is out of the Challenge fabric but if anyone needs some she can probably get more from Always Quilting.

Free Table: The next Free Table will be June 23 from 9-11:30 a.m. at Jess' home. She has a lot of items besides fabric this time including notions, rulers and irons.

PQ Quilt Show: Entries will be accepted from July 23 to Aug. 25 on the PQ website. A photo and dimensions are required (80" x 90" is the max size). There is a charge of \$5 per quilter for as many quilts as you'd like to submit. A limited number of large quilts will be hung due to space issues. Please rank your quilts in order of preference for showing as she may not be able to accept all entries. All quilts accepted should be dropped off to Jess Sept. 11-18. Julie Curry will organize quilts for the hanging, which will be on Sept 22. The show is Sept 23-24. After the show finishes on 9/24, the quilts will be taken to Ruth Gilroy's home where they can be picked up. Admission has been adjusted to \$10 for exhibitors and volunteers and \$15 for all others. Wristbands will allow entry on both days. Unfortunately, due to a family emergency, Susan Williams is unable to do the show promotion, so Jess is looking for another volunteer to contact guilds, stores, etc., to get the word out.

Fund Raising: Leonie Batkin talked about the Opportunity Quilt for 2023-2024. Production is in progress. The team consists of Sandi DaRoza, Angi Merlone, Gretchen Michaels, Wanda Lewis Dragon and Leonie Batkin. It will be an art quilt with a flower garden theme. The promotion team consists of Maggie Harvey, Dorothea Copeck-Nolan and Brenda Ziegler. Before Leonie concluded her remarks, she asked everyone to stand and show their appreciation to Jess for all her hard work. The applause went on for some time, and Jess looked truly stunned and humbled.

Alice's Love: Barb Hall & Margaret Conti reminded us that the event will take place after the general meeting in July. Please confirm your attendance with Margaret. You can bring a charity quilt to work on or there will be some kits available. The organizers are also supplying special labels.

Programs: Connie Bowles expressed the thanks of Mills Peninsula for the donations made to Nurses Appreciation Day.

General Business: Sandy Kelly requested budget info be sent. She reviewed the correct use of trash/recycle/compost bins at the Garden Center. Full trash bags should go in the dumpster.

She asked for nominations for Quilter of the Year. The vote will be in August. She also asked for volunteers for a Nominating Committee for next year's Board positions. Mary Raftery, Anne Merics and Sandy herself volunteered. The open positions comprise Email Blaster, Activities and Educational Events chair, Opportunity Quilt lead for the 2024-25 OQ, lead for the Auction, assistant for Speakers and Workshops 2025, lead for the Holiday Party, Virtual Events and Night Recording Secretary. The nominated names will be printed in the newsletter and voted on in September.

Membership: Anne Merics stated that there were 50 members present plus four guests and eight members on Zoom. We have a total of 159 members. Membership raffle basket winners were Sandy Kelly and Lori Atwood.

Queer Threads, through Aug. 20, 2023: Turner, Gilliland, Finlayson and Porcella Galleries. Guest curator: John Chaich. *Queer Threads* is a traveling group exhibition and coffee-table book exploring contemporary lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, and queer experiences through fiber and textile traditions. This latest iteration spotlights 35 artists with roots in the American West, Northwest, and Southwest, as well as work from the museum's collection. From the impeccably finished to the intentionally raw, many works are fully executed through thread-based processes such as crochet, embroidery, quilting, and weaving, while others interact with animation, clay, light, metal, and photography. Each artist's use of material choices and technical finishes suggest poetic and subversive intentions.
