**Modern Madras Table Runner** is the best project for new ombre enthusiasts because it just uses 3 Ombre SKY fabrics per side. It's a reversible table runner that is easy to make due to simple piecing and comes together quickly. Students get to focus more on the color and less on construction. Bonus learning golden nugget is that Jennifer teaches in depth how to matchstick quilt which gives this textile fabulous texture. And it's great as a piece on the back of a couch or bottom of the bed. Not

just a table runner! Students consistently give this class a **Five Star** review. You can use your own ombre fabrics or purchase Jennifer's ombre fabrics or a class kit on her website. It is suggested that you purchase her book that contains the pattern but <u>it is not mandatory</u>. A discount code and supply list will be provided when you sign up for this fun workshop. Jennifer will be at Asilomar in May 2023!

I also have a little bit of extra yardage, which I'll release after everyone who wants a fat quarter has one. That will be first come/first served, \$10/yard.

The meeting was called to order at 10:01 a.m.

**President (Sandy Kelly)** postponed approval of the January board meeting minutes until next month since the newsletter had not been released yet. She discussed the New Member Event timing. Due to other activities, the event will be held in April. Barb and Justine will organize it including goody bags for each new member.

**Treasurer (Sara Medina)** reported that the issue with PayPal has been resolved. #### **Member Profile: Annette Caves**

Annette Caves grew up in a family of "doers" and has continued the tradition. From San Francisco to Sebastopol to San Jose State to San Carlos, Annette has stayed busy. She grew up doing all the home crafts -- sewing, embroidery, needlepoint, gardening, cooking -- but there was no time for quilting until her daughters left home. She converted her older daughter's bedroom to a quilting room; then, she bought a long arm and needed the twins' bedroom. And now she is enjoying the time to quilt her October retirement has given her.

But practicing home arts is only a small part of Annette's life. She was an occupational therapist all her working life serving in traditional physical therapy fields to concentrating on



pediatric eating. In addition, for 10 years before COVID she has volunteered with children in foster receiving home, from home-cooking weekly meals with them, to collecting people's nolonger-used suitcases so each child would have something other than plastic bags for his/her few possessions, and now is gathering quilts to give each child to be his/her own. Because there are so few foster parents many, particularly teenagers, are in need of homes and places to stay and have to sleep on air mattresses in the facility office. She is so pleased that P.Q. members have been helping with these endeavors. When she talks about these experiences, her joy in the children is evident.

She, laughing, says that she and her husband have never been empty-nesters. There is always someone. Since August, a family from Ukraine has been living with them. Annette says they have hit the jackpot with this family. Peninsula Quilters hit the jackpot when Annette joined the guild.
