Upcoming Programs:



Peninsula Quilters Board Meeting Dec. 6, 2023

Attendees: Sandy Kelly, Leonie Batkin, Justine Barnard, Carol Blitzer, Connie Bowles, Terry Caselton, Julie Curry, Jean Dail, Barb Hall, Nancy Krosse, Anne Merics, Marylin Morton, Michele Parry, Jena Walter and Brenda Ziegler

The meeting was called to order at 10:01 a.m.

President (Sandy Kelly) requested approval of the October minutes and then the November minutes. Both were passed. She then made us aware that Jean Dail has received scam emails purporting to be from Sandy. Others have received similar emails. Everyone should be conscious of this issue and call to verify any suspicious communications.

Treasurer (Jean Dail) completed the audit. Jean, Sara Medina and Michele Parry reviewed it. She was pleased to report that we broke even for the year. The CD investment has already received interest, and both our liquid and CD accounts are well funded. She thanked Sara Medina for the great job she did as Treasurer.

Membership (Anne Merics & Justine Barnard) stated that we now have a total of 143 members of which 18 are new, 121 are renewals and 4 are Life Members. There was then a discussion of the Life Member program. We are allowed a maximum of 10 Life Members but currently have only 4. Sandy will remind the membership that nominations are accepted any time for new Life Members. A short write-up of the qualifications and past service to the guild of the person being nominated, should be submitted to the board, which will make final determination. A couple people were proposed by board members. Recipients receive a certificate that Jena will create. Subsequently, Anne also asked how long the sign-in sheets should be kept. Per Michele Parry, they do not need to be kept at all.

Opportunity Quilt (Leonie Batkin) asked for additional stock of the PQ postcards; Anne can supply some. Jena manages these cards, which need updating with the next printing. Leonie said the proceeds from the display on the sale day at Always Quilting were too low to justify doing that again. She felt there was inadequate advertising.

Newsletter (Carol Blitzer) asked to move the deadline for items to the newsletter up to 12/22 due to her traveling during the holidays. Sandy suggested 12/21. Carol said she has to spend time tracking down Show & Tell photos. To solve this, Julie Curry offered to take photos at the meetings and send them from there. Help from someone slightly more technically savvy would be appreciated.

Sandy adjourned the meeting at 10:40 a.m.

PQ General Meeting Minutes Dec. 20, 2023

Sandy Kelly called the meeting to order at 9:35 a.m. The meeting was held at the San Mateo Garden Center and offered on Zoom.

President: Sandy Kelly welcomed guests and checked that everyone who submitted a gift for exchange received a numbered ticket from Cynthia Yin and a blue raffle ticket from Terry Caselton for use during the holiday party following the meeting. She then recognized that it was a time to celebrate multiple holidays including Hanukkah, Kwanzaa and others. A motion was made to approve the November minutes and approved by the members present. Speakers should stand at the X taped on the floor so that Zoom participants can see them.

Finance: Jean Dail reported that Sara Medina helped significantly with the audit and offered her thanks. Our liquid assets are good, and up to half of the CD funds can be drawn if needed. Some monies were received this month from workshops and renewals.

Corresponding Secretary and Holiday Party: Terry Caselton sent a condolence card to Angi Merlone who lost her mother recently. She talked about the holiday party including \$25 gift certificates from Always Quilting – one each for the most festive and the most creative centerpieces. There will be a gift exchange, bingo game for prizes and catered lunch. She thanked all her helpers including John Green who supplied music for us.

President: Sandy Kelly discussed the Life Member program. Anyone can nominate someone with years of contributions to the guild to become a Life Member. Nominations should be given to Sandy and will be reviewed by the board.

Art in Action, a non-profit that supports art education in schools, asked if we can help them by cutting 12" x 18" pieces from bolts of muslin they supplied. Helpers were asked to stay after the party for about an hour to help. Title I schools receive Art in Action programs at no charge.

The Pajaro Dunes Quilt Guild will have a show in February.

Submittals for the January newsletter need to be received by 12/21 due to the holiday.


