## Quilt Show Update

Here's the face of our postcard, which will be spread far and wide to quilt shops and other locations where we hope to reach potential attendees. Sara Guyol and Sandi daRoza have agreed to coordinate our publicity and promotion to guilds and shops.

Entries will be accepted from July 23 to Aug. 25 on the PQ website. A photo and dimensions are required (80" x 90" is the max size) so Julie Curry can finalize our layout and make the hanging process go quickly and smoothly.

There is a charge of \$5 per quilter for as many quilts you'd like to submit. All quilts accepted should be delivered to Jess between Sept. 11-18. After the show finishes on Sept. 24, the quilts will be taken to Ruth Gilroy's home where they can be picked up either Sunday evening or Monday morning. Admission has been adjusted to \$10 for exhibitors and volunteers and \$15 for all others. Wristbands will allow entry on both days.

Volunteers will be needed to help hang the show, work during the show, and take the quilts down after the show. We expect to have iVolunteer ready for sign-ups by July 23.

## Member Profile: Nancy Krosse

In October, Nancy Krosse will become Peninsula Quilters new Vice President. It's a good time for all of us to get to know her better. She brings to the job and Peninsula Quilters in general a life associated with sewing including 30 years of quilting.

Nancy was born in Redding, Penn., to parents who had moved from Brooklyn to "some place rural." Her father was a salesman with the Talon zipper company, and in her teens she would travel with him during summer vacation to help set up thread and zipper displays in fabric shops. She'd learned the color chart early. As he progressed in the company, he was transferred and the family moved west with him.





Her own experiences with sewing were pretty much confined to middle school Home Ec classes until she joined a mothers' group after the birth of her first baby. One of the members had a quilt hanging in her home, which was identical to a quilt Nancy's mother had made. They were from a class at Laurel Leaf. That led to Nancy being lured into the quilting world where she has stayed for 30 years. First it was a Round Robin in the mothers' group; then it was classes with her mother; then Bev Stuckey's camp in Tahoe. At camp she met Joann Dunbar and Phyllis Obley, which has led to years of quilting together.

At a birthday party for Phyllis, Nancy met Gale Green who encouraged her to join the guild. Nancy tried it, but her schedule didn't mesh with the guild's. Then, Covid hit and the zoom meetings and zoom retreats started, and Nancy took to those quickly and happily as a way to socialize and keep busy while shut in. When in-person meetings resumed, Nancy adjusted her schedule to the guild's. She has been an active and productive member since then.

In quilting she loves the piecing. She loves to find a block that "works for her," listen to an audio book, and chain piece away. That's her time of zen.

She does have a life outside of quilting. She was a flight attendant who married a pilot. They have two children -- a son who is 31 and will be married in October, and a daughter, 29, who was married in May. When not quilting or participating in the excitement of the wedding hubbub, she loves to garden. A favorite activity is going to nurseries, picking out new plants and bringing them home to plant and enjoy. Her second time of zen comes when she is making soup. Her husband calls her a "gifted souptress" who can empty the refrigerator and create a new and wonderful soup. She loves to travel and recently beguiled all with the wonders of her cruise through Norway.

Peninsula quilters have two exciting years coming with Nancy Krosse.

## Peninsula Quilters Board Meeting July 5, 2023

The meeting was called to order at 10:04 a.m.

**President (Sandy Kelly)** asked for approval of the June Board Minutes. Motion was made, seconded and approved by all.

**Treasurer (Sara Medina)** stated that the last funds from Chase have been moved to San Mateo Credit Union (SMCU). Sara and Jean contacted Vanguard to move funds. Vanguard still had Ruth listed as the contact. Ruth said she will request the account be closed today, and a check will be sent out. These funds will be deposited at SMCU. Regarding the draft budget for next year, Sara will firm up and send it out this week. She's looking mainly at activities with highest costs: Programs, Speakers, Workshops, Outreach, Opportunity Quilt. Numbers look good. Estimating Outreach cost based on 80 quilts. The Board will review in August. Sara will miss the July meeting but will send info to Sandy to report.

**Correspondence (Rose Wilson)** contacted Susan Williams who has a family emergency. Beth Alexander passed away in June. The notice from her family will be sent out in a blast.

**Parliamentarian (Michele Parry)** asked whether we wanted the roster to indicate which phone number is preferred for those who gave both home and cell numbers. The paper registration forms allow members to list two numbers. The PayPal form only requests one number. It was decided that the PayPal form will be updated for two numbers but that we do not need to indicate preference. The new rosters will be available at the November meeting. Also, Anne mentioned the \$5 guest fee. Since this issue is part of the bylaws, it was determined that the issue will be included the next time the membership prepares for the bylaws update.

**Opportunity Quilt (Leonie Batkin)** informed us that Carol Stapleton will attend the July general meeting and will pull the winning ticket for her OQ. Barb will introduce her.

**Programs (Connie Bowles)** said Gale Green volunteered to organize the birthday and Connie will assist. She asked for other volunteers within the board.

**Speakers & Workshops (Wanda Lewis Dragon)** has four workshops and four speakers scheduled for next year. Also, activities will be scheduled after day meetings for those who wish to attend. Barb will demonstrate 3D, and Julie will discuss binding. Carol requested that the workshop info also be sent to her.

**Virtual Events (Jena Walters)** pointed out that we should update our Zoom accounts when notified. It's a good practice to log in to a meeting a bit early to see if an update is required as that may take some time for implementation. If you have issues, check to see if another window that is hidden from you was opened by Zoom.

**Alice's Love (Barb Hall)** requested that we let members know that set up will be after the conclusion of the meeting and the speaker in the July general meeting. She will co-ordinate getting electrical cords with Terry and irons with Anne.

At 9:36 a.m., President Sandy Kelly called the meeting to order.

She also reminded attendees that raffle tickets would be sold at the break, as well as raffle tickets for From Me to You and A Little Something for the Guild. This drawing will be held at the August general meeting. If you are unable to attend, you may prioritize wanted items and send along with another member. Review of the order of the meeting: reminder to attendees this is the last chance for PQ Opportunity Quilt raffle tickets, with the creator, Carol Stapleton, drawing the winning ticket after our speaker. There were five Zoom members in attendance.

**Approval of June minutes:** Terry Caselton made a motion to approve the minutes, Sandy Adger seconded. June minutes were approved.

**Treasurer Report (Sandy Kelly for Sara Medina):** Accounts were closed with Chase on June 30, 2023, and moved to San Mateo Credit Union. Third-quarter financials are being reviewed and will be reported on in August.
