Connie Bowles a member of PQ for a number of years, has taught at quilt shops in the Bay Area and at the Kauai Quilt Guild. She has been quilting since 2002 and the thing she likes best about quilting is being inspired by new patterns, techniques and, of course, fabric. Connie enjoys sharing her love of quilting and her skills with all levels of quilters.





Connie will share her method for making tipsy blocks, which create movement across the quilt. It's easy to piece, and the result will be a quilt that will make you smile. Though it may look complicated, once you get into the rhythm, it's simply fun. So, grab your fat quarters and let's create some joy.

Kellie Willey's quilting journey began in 2008 when she met her future mother-in-law Sally, a quilter. Shortly after the wedding Sally gave Kellie a vintage Kenmore sewing machine, a rotary cutter, a cutting mat, a ruler and invited her to share her stash and her friend's stash. Kellie took a beginner quilting class and was hooked. At first she worked on lap-sized quilts until Sally's sister taught her how to foundation piece and make a small quilt. This started her obsession with making tiny quilts.



Fun stash buster! Create log cabin style blocks with a twist by setting them on-point. This little Modern quilt is quick to make using a variety of scraps or a Charm-Pack while following easy pattern steps. The Pattern can be adapted to go tiny (Micro Mini) or Mini or make it larger than 11" x 14" the choice is yours. During the workshop, techniques on design and piecing will be taught as well as a demonstration on how to quilt your finished top in a modern way. Also learn how to make a smaller binding that fits the size of your quilt. Your quilt top can be completed in class with only the quilting left to do. *Pattern must be purchased prior to the class and will be available February 2021 at www.littlequiltcreations.com*

MAY WORKSHOP *"DRESDEN SWEATSHIRT JACKET" with Anelie Belden* Dates: May 12 & 13 Time: 9:00AM – 12:00PM each day 2 Day



Anelie Belden is a nationally known sewing instructor, quilt and pattern designer and author. She began sewing by constructing garments which lead to her degree in Fashion Design. While working in the fashion industry she began to explore the art of quilting which became her passion. She has taken the traditional Dresden quilt design and created new updated Dresden Designs which are featured in her book "



Let's have a fun day using a sweatshirt and recreating it into a comfortable stylish jacket. This is a loose-fitting jacket and <u>does not require difficult garment sewing techniques</u>. It can be long or short, loose or fitted. The edges are fully trimmed using Dresden blades which creates a clean finish on all outside edges. Adding a collar and a creative zipper makes **this jacket is a show stopper**. Piping and embellishing can be added to the design. *Each student is required to purchase a \$12.00 pattern which includes the jacket zipper. There will be some advance preparation before class so you can complete the jacket to wear.*

2. Make a quilt of any size -- a placemat or a mug rug is enough, and a king-size quilt is not too much! -- using a recognizable amount of the challenge fabric on the front; binding is OK. The theme for the Challenge is "Connections," inspired by the ideas that our Guild is all about our connections to one another, and a quilt is all about connecting pieces of fabric and batting!

3. Email photographs of your project to Jena Walter (jenakwalter@gmail.com) on or before <u>April 12</u>. Please send at least four photos - (a) complete front, (b) front detail, (c) back, and (d) label. If you want to submit more, you may.

Jena will assemble a slideshow of the entries, which we will "Blast" a few days before the April meeting, and will show again during the meeting. The members in attendance at the April meeting will vote for

They can be simply quilted on the home machines or tied. Angi has offered to baste the quilt sandwiches for anyone interested in quilting on their home machines. Julie announced that we will be refocusing on our LifeMoves charity. The CZU Fire need has been met. We donated 70 quilts.

Sandi daRoza announced the candidates for Quilter of the Year: **Ruth Gilroy**, **Sandy Kelly**, **Michele Parry**, and **Jena Walter**. We voted by poll on Zoom last night and those who didn't vote last night will get another chance at the March meeting. If you want to send your vote to Sandi's email that works too. Also the New Member Tea will be held on Saturday, April 24, on Zoom. More information to follow.

<u>Jena Walter</u> offered to gather information from any willing Accuquilt owners. If any of you are interested in borrowing or lending dies for the machine, she will compile a list. More information to follow.

Minutes, Zoom Peninsula Quilters Board Meeting February 6, 2021

The meeting was called to order at 10 a.m. by Angi. Sara pointed out a typo in the minutes from the January meeting regarding finances. [Secretary's comment: The January board meeting minutes are correct as submitted; the minutes from the January general meeting do contain a typo on the amount in the Chase and Vanguard accounts. The amounts should be: Vanguard - \$19,824.76 and Chase - \$45,103.94 and should be corrected at the next general meeting.] The minutes were otherwise approved.

Committee Reports:

Corresponding secretary: Arlene sent thank you notes to the donors of the Featherweights raffled in December.

Membership: Anne reported that two new members joined last month, making a total of six new members this year. Sara mentioned that there was another new member form in the P.O. Box.

Treasurer's report: The Vanguard account has \$19,830.58; the checking account has \$44,591.94; there are about \$500 in checks outstanding.

Activities and Outreach: Judy reported that the annual challenge is underway; quilts will be displayed at the April meeting. There are currently 10 donation quilts awaiting quilting. Blasts have been sent out but not many takers. Barb, Wanda, Kathy, and Angi will take some to quilt. There was a discussion on how to recruit more people to do the quilting. Paying to have someone quilt them was brought up, but it was thought this was not an optimal solution. Angi will bring the topic up at the general meeting, and Judy will present options.

Free Table: Angi announced that there will be a free table at her house in February; she will send a blast.

Quilter of the Year: Sandi reported that 48 members have nominated; nominations are due by the March meeting.

New Member Tea: Sandi announced that the new member tea will be April 24, from 1-3 p.m.

Old Business: None

New Business: Thank you to Barb Hall for organizing the most recent retreat, and especially for contacting new members to let them get involved.

Workshops: Terry reported that the people giving the next workshop want to use their own platform. It was not clear exactly what this means for us and how our links are set up: Terry will investigate further.

Meeting adjourned at 10:40 p.m.
