Well, the snow is falling, thank goodness not where we live, and creating a magical wonderland. I spent the first week of November at a retreat in South Lake Tahoe at Zephyr Cove Conference Center. This is a great location on the lake, however, it is a bit rustic. I took a class from Betty Busby who specializes in Art Quilting. She has a unique approach to creating Art Quilts with dimensional affects using her unique method of cutting painted Pellon 830 with a Cameo 4 cutter. It is fun with amazing results from this technique. In addition, you create your own fabric colors using fabric paint. You can paint a background for your work or you can use a thin vinyl cut out for a relief image. If you want to learn more, see me at our next meeting.

I want to thank Grace Hardy for creating the kits and demonstrating how to make fun winter trees. We had an enthusiastic group. The demo and instructions from Grace were easy to follow plus each person who participated received a set of templates to make their own forest. The demo was followed by a large turnout of folks sewing for our Bee Charitable sewing session.

The Watercolor Quilt is a wall hanging that finishes 32 x 32 and is made from one large block that uses curved piecing to create the illusion of transparency from overlapping circles. The class will cover my process for building a fabric gradation and tips and tricks for stress-free curved piecing. Take the guesswork out of color selection by using one of the published color gradations inside the pattern. Students need to purchase the pattern online. Modern Madras Table Runner is the best project for new ombre enthusiasts because it just uses 3 Ombre SKY fabrics per side. It's a reversible table runner that is easy to make due to simple piecing and comes together quickly. Students get to focus more on the color and less on construction. Bonus learning golden nugget is that Jennifer teaches in depth how to matchstick quilt which gives this textile fabulous texture. And it's great as a piece on the back of a couch or bottom of the bed. Not

just a table runner! Students consistently give this class a **Five Star** review. You can use your own ombre fabrics or purchase Jennifer's ombre fabrics or a class kit on her website. It is suggested that you purchase her book that contains the pattern but <u>it is not mandatory</u>. A discount code and supply list will be provided when you sign up for this fun workshop. Sandy Kelly called the meeting to order at 9:34 a.m. The meeting was held at the San Mateo Garden Center & offered on Zoom.

Sandy welcomed two members of the Pajaro Valley Quilt Association who sold raffle tickets for their beautiful Tipsy Tea & Tasty Cakes Opportunity Quilt. They also announced their 45th Annual Quilt Show to be held at the Santa Cruz County Fairgrounds in February. A representative from PQ will be showing our quilt to their members in this exchange.

A motion was made to approve the October minutes, seconded and approved by the members present.

Finance: Sara Medina gave a favorable financial report including good revenues continuing for our Opportunity Quilt.

Corresponding Secretary: Rose Wilson will be sending a condolence card to the family of Lorraine Strong who passed away recently. Sandy Kelly stated that a \$50 donation will be made to the San Jose Quilt Museum in Lorraine's honor. Rose read a thank you card from Sue Garcia who lost her husband.

Holiday Party: Maggie Harvey asked for volunteers for table decorations and desserts. Centerpieces will be provided. Several contests are planned: best holiday sweater, best outfit, etc. Be in it to win it! There will be two volunteer activities:

- 1. Toy Drive please bring one or more unwrapped toys to be donated to the local fire department
- 2. Gift Exchange bring a wrapped gift (\$20-\$25 max value)

Workshops & Speakers: Terry Castleton has lined up four workshops (three in person at the San Mateo Garden Center and one virtual). Cost is \$50 each. May 17: SMGC – Jennifer Sampou presents Modern Madras Table Runner. Her class, which follows the meeting, teaches the runner that uses ombre fabrics and teaches how to matchstick a guilt. She will be at Asilomar in May 2023.

The winner of last month's \$300 discount certificate to Asilomar has offered it to another member. Terry Castleton will send out a blast asking anyone who will be attending to let her know. Once names are collected, one will be anonymously selected to receive the certificate.



Peninsula Quilters Guild Board Meeting November 2, 2022

Attendees: Sandy Kelly, Sandi daRosa, Sara Medina, Brenda Ziegler, Rose Wilson, Michele Parry, Kathy McGuffin, Carol Blitzer, Angi Merlone, Leonie Batkin, Justine Bernard, Julie Curry, Jena Walter, Barb Hall, Maggie Harvey and Wanda Lewis Dragon.

The meeting was called to order at 10:02 a.m.

President (Sandy Kelly) discussed approval of the minutes from last month. Minutes should be approved after publication. They are published in each following month's newsletter. Since the November meeting fell prior to the newsletter release, approval of the minutes was postponed until next month.

Treasurer (Sara Medina) reported that some of our reserves were spent down for uses previously approved.

Correspondence (Rose Wilson) reported that she will be sending a condolence card to Susan Garcia on the passing of her husband. There was a discussion whether to consider additional acknowledgement. It was pointed out that for the death of a PQ member, the guild makes a \$50 donation to the San Jose Quilt Museum in their honor. It was approved that we make no changes to the current policy.

Parliamentarian (Michele Parry) has the new roster almost ready for print. The revised back cover of the roster will list virtual links to PQ events. Confirmation was requested as to the number of affiliates. It was noted that the December General Meeting will start at 9:30 a.m.

There was a discussion regarding the Friday Open Sew. It doesn't seem to be getting much use. Final decision was to keep it open and available.

Activities and Educational Events (Angi Merlone) asked about the quilt display at the Redwood City Library. It was mentioned that it has been used in the past to show Challenge quilts and suggestions were made of ways it could be used for outreach.

Fund Raising (Leonie Batkin) asked for review of some of the items listed under Fund Raising that may actually fall under Activities and Educational Events. She and Angi will review.

Membership (Justine Bernard) reported that we have 139 members. Justine will check to verify renewal of all the affiliates. At this point, one affiliate renewal has not been received yet. Sandy also acknowledged and thanked Anne and Justine on all the work they have done on the recent membership drive.

Programs (Connie Bowles) was absent but sent a note informing us that there are three inhouse and one virtual workshops scheduled so far for 2023.

Outreach (Julie Curry) has sent out 10 kits for the coming retreat. There are three Bee Charitable events scheduled: one after the November General meeting, one for Alice's Love in March and the 2023 San Mateo County Fair.

Retreats (Barb Hall) has 54 excited quilters signed up for the virtual retreat the first weekend in November.

Holiday Party (Maggie Harvey) has volunteers organizing the Holiday Party. She questioned whether the refrigerator at the Garden Center was available for use. It was confirmed that the Garden Center needs to be notified of the need so that they can be sure it's plugged in.

Sandy Kelly closed the meeting, with thanks to all, at 10:49 a.m.
