What she likes most about quilting is that it is forgiving. Something goes wrong and the quilter can just rework the project into something else. Baby quilts are her main focus because she can make them start to finish on her 40-year-old Elna. Attending P.Q. retreats, she has made many of Julie Curry's twin projects and passed the tops onto Julie for the guild's charities.

Carol grew up in Bell in southern California and came north for college. She and her husband of 53 years live in Palo Alto where they raised two daughters, one of whom lives in New York and the other lives in San Francisco with her 3-year-old son.

Minutes, PQ General Meeting September 21, 2022

The meeting at the San Mateo Garden Center, with additional Zoom participation, was called to order by Sandi da Roza at 9:35 a.m.

The minutes of the August meeting were approved.

Sandy Kelly announced the slate of elected board members for 2022-23:

President: Sandy Kelly

Vice President: open

Recording Secretaries: Brenda Ziegler (mornings and board meetings)/Holly Colgan (evenings)

Corresponding Secretary: Rose Wilson

Treasurer: Sara Medina

The slate was approved with no dissent.

Treasurer's report (Sara Medina): Sara presented the proposed budget for 2022-23 and explained the major changes.

Q: Why are there different type faces for some items? A: To avoid confusion.

Q: Is the total income really less than the total outflow? A: Yes, when possible, the budget errs on the side of caution for expenses and some items may be over-budgeted. The treasurer believes that the income can cover real expenses, and that PQ can dip into reserves in case of need.

Q: What are the on-line services fees? A: These include Zoom costs, web site hosting, annual fees for other apps.

Q: Is the \$12,000 shortfall in revenue covered by savings? A: Yes, but PQ is unlikely to need to go to reserves.

Q: Are some items budgeted in order to have pre-approval? A: Yes.

Q: Don't understand Alice's Love - what's up here? A: PQ received donations amounting to \$15,000 from the family of late member Alice Lam; these funds were designated for membership events.

Comment: PQ has funds in bank accounts growing for several years, the budget was purposely allowed to grow in order to fund speakers and costs of in-person speakers, which we have not had for the past few years.

Comment: Sandy Adger encouraged members to participate in fund-raising activities.

Call for vote on proposed budget: approved with no objections.

Corresponding Secretary's report (Linda Hester): Nothing to report

Studio Tour (Connie Bowles): The Studio Tour will be Saturday, Oct. 8, from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. Tickets are \$25 per person. Ticket buyers will receive 20% discounts from affiliates Always Quilting and Serge-a-lot, and will be entered into drawings for gift baskets. People who haven't bought tickets yet can sign-up on-line with PayPal: they will receive addresses when they pay. People can also sign-up the day of the tour: contact Connie.

Outreach (Judy Miyake): The next Bee Charitable event will be on Wednesday, Nov. 16, after the general meeting.

Holiday Party: Maggie Harvey will chair this event. Please volunteer to help!

Fund raising (Jess Millikan): We still need volunteers to both sell tickets and provide White Glove assistance. We need to provide 12 White Glove volunteers on Thursday, Oct. 13 and Saturday, Oct. 15. Sign up on iVolunteer.

Retreat (Barb Hall): The next virtual retreat will be Nov. 4-6. Signups begin after the October meeting. Julie Curry will have a project designed by Elizabeth Allocco - and kits!
