Sue Rasmussen: A Desperate Housewife's Quilt Journey (Suerasmussenquilts.com)

February 19, 2020



A diversified quilt instructor since 1988, Sue Rasmussen has degrees in Textile Science and Agricultural Economics and has produced an extensive and varied body of work, including hundreds of quilts, quilt art and quilted clothing, many of which are nationally exhibited.

Tonight's humorous presentation, showing dozens of Sue's quilts, takes you through her development as a quilt maker in the two main quilt styles that Sue loves and is known for: Intricate Pieced Quilts and Machine Pieced Landscape—Pictorial Quilts. Emphasizing her more recent quilts, Sue will discuss several quilts in detail: the importance of design, color, fabric, choices and quilting patterns. The lecture ends with several story quilts that are guaranteed to make you giggle.

“Machine Quilting on your home sewing machine” featuring Sue Rasmussen

Workshop: Thursday, February 20, 2020

This workshop teaches students, while working through several exercises, the basics of free-motion machine quilting on a home sewing machine. Beginning with simple shapes, students work through many quilt designs such as echo quilting, stippling and other “filler” designs, and simple curves to more complex designs. Class includes discussions of basting techniques, difference in batting, marking quilt tops, comparisons of threads and needles, and quilt binding.

2020 PQ Challenge: “P is for”

P is for Peninsula Quilters, of course. And pumpkins, or purple, or “she persisted,” or a Pine Tree quilt block. Use your imagination and your favorite quilting technique and participate (another “p” word!) in the 2020 Challenge. We’ll show the quilts and vote on our favorites at the April Guild meeting. If we have at least six people who want to enter their quilts in the Fair, we’ll have a challenge category there too.

We’ve got more fabric (the first 6 yards we bought were all scooped up!), and we’ll have some available at the February and March Guild meetings. If you’d like to get some sooner, or if you want to reserve some in case it runs out again, please contact Jess (jbmilikan8@gmail.com or 415-509-6083).

Rules: Use a recognizable amount of the fabric on the front of the quilt (binding is OK); perimeter minimum 80” and maximum 144”. \$5 entry fee.

Prizes: Viewer's Choice; Best Use of Challenge Fabric; Most Creative Interpretation of Challenge Theme; Best Construction of Quilt Top; Best Quilting.

Fragrance-free meetings: Please remember that all PQ meetings and workshops are “fragrance free.”

How big should a twin-size quilt be? Given that LifeMoves prefers quilts that will fit a twin bed or larger, finished quilts should be a minimum of 65” x 80”. Why? They fit on 4 yards of backing (two 2-yard pieces joined by one seam), and they fit on a 2-yard piece of batting off the bolt or a twin-sized packaged batting (72” x 90”).

Meeting called to order at 11:57 by Jena Walter. Minutes from the previous board meeting approved as published.

Committee Reports:

Activities (Judy Miyake):

Annual challenge is underway and is sold out

Next retreat is already full

No fair news

Fundraising (Gale Green): The guild made \$50 from Carol Stapleton's bags today.

Membership (Ruth Gilmore): Two new members, Sandra Canales and Barb Sanders. We currently have 135 members.

Newsletter (Carol Blitzer): People are good at getting articles in by the deadline.

Question: Why did we stop taking pictures at the meetings? Kathy McGuffin answered that it was time consuming and no one seemed to want them. Summary of discussion: There will be a few pictures taken for the newsletter and website, but there is no guarantee that we will keep them.

Outreach: (Julie Curry): Going well

Website (Kathy McGuffin): The newsletter and website are coordinating well. The online forms for membership and workshops are being used, and there seem to be no problems.

Treasurer's Report (Leslie Lohmeier): Paypal cost vs benefits: a \$50 workshop costs us \$1.75 base fee plus \$0.30 per transaction, or roughly 2%. The board voted to leave the present system (i.e., the guild absorbs the Paypal fees) as is until the next budgeting period. Julie made a suggestion to add a transaction fee to cover payments by check to encourage use of Paypal; this will be taken up at the July meeting.

New Business:

Sutter Health Hospice request: Ruth shared some photographs of the type of quilts they're looking for. Carol would like a more detailed discussion of what is expected of us. Jena will contact them to arrange for a representative to attend a PQ meeting and bring a sample, preferably at the March meeting.

Michele suggested that this could be an opportunity to create a bee; she will distribute an article from Quilters' News Magazine on quilts for Alzheimer's patients.

Kathy suggested that we put a reminder in the newsletter about strong scents at meetings and parties. This would also be an opportunity to remind people yet again to silence their cell phones, as well as reminding them that any donations left behind at meetings may be trashed.

Terry is booking workshop presenters for 2021. Jena has been able to book the rooms at Silicon Valley Community Foundation through 2021.

Julie would like to move the Scrappy Bee to the new location, as it is better heated and lit.

Angi raised some concerns about the low attendance at the Holiday party: How do we encourage people to attend? Suggestions included have a luncheon, go back to having a buffet, have a pot luck but with the guild providing a main dish or two, have a theme for food, get a caterer (or order "catering food" plus 2-3 people to work the kitchen). Another suggestion was to charge a small fee, refundable at the Holiday Party, to encourage people to attend.

Resolution: we will keep brainstorming ways to make the party better attended. Gale, Michele and Jena volunteered to coordinate the next Holiday Party.

Meeting adjourned at 12:50.

Upcoming Workshops

“Only One” featuring Dora Cary <https://www.orangedotquilts.com> Thursday and Friday, March 19 & 20, 2020

Make a stunning quilt with one piece of fabric and a much-simplified One Block Wonder technique. Say NO to fussy cutting and Y seams and YES to super fast cutting tips and chain stitching straight lines to create gorgeous blocks that will make an amazing quilt. The pattern requires only one fabric and includes fabric requirements for all quilt sizes. In the first day of class Dora will explain her super fast method for cutting the fabric for the blocks and share tips for fast piecing and how to reduce the bulk at the intersection of four seams. The second day of class, students will finish sewing their blocks and she will share composition tips. Depending on the chosen quilt size, most students should have a finished quilt top. At the end of the class Dora will share her No Baste Method for quilting on a home sewing machine (not on a long arm). Kits (fabric plus pattern) will be available to purchase in class. The class is perfect for quilters of all levels. Each student will need to purchase a quilt pattern.

“Dresden Jacket & Quilt (your choice)” featuring Anelie Belden www.miystudio.net Thursday, April 16, 2020

This jacket is made using a sweatshirt of your choice. It can be long or short, loose or fitted. We will cut it up and then add a flowing Dresden design onto the body of the jacket. Dresden blades are used to make the collar and the trim around the edge. A zipper is used as a closure. Piping and embellishing can be added to the design. This is a loose-fitting jacket and does not require difficult garment sewing techniques.

“The Outer Limits” featuring Julia Curry Thursday, May 21, 2020

Do you remember that old TV show? “You are about to participate in a great adventure. You are about to experience the awe and mystery, which reach from the inner mind to... The Outer Limits.” This pattern will “blow your mind”!! It looks so complicated, but Julie has developed a method using 3” strips sewn into panels and cut into cross-sections. Using her system, you can easily create this awesome quilt. Prepare to explore...The Outer Limits!

Through April 12, 2020 Inside Out: Seeing Through Clothing - Clothing acts as both a boundary and bridge between the body and the world. At once utilitarian and deeply expressive, clothing offers protection from external conditions while extending our inner selves—our identities, desires and beliefs—to the surface of our bodies and beyond. This dynamic relationship between inside and outside will be explored in *Inside Out: Seeing Through Clothing*, featuring the work of 11 artists who investigate the boundary that clothing creates between the self and world. Working in the fields of sculpture, photography, installation and textile art, these artists consider themes of transparency, openness, interiority and visibility to create objects that invite us in while reaching out. Their works reimagine clothing as a radical and poetic form, capable of revealing hidden—and often uncomfortable—truths while dissolving boundaries between interior and exterior worlds. Artists include Reiko Fujii, Claudia Casarino, Charlotte Kruk, Robin Lasser & Adrienne Pao, Victoria May, Kate Mitchell, Laura Raboff, Beverly Rayner, Rose Sellery, and Jean Shin. Through April 12, 2020 Never Ending Thread - Shirley Cunningham and Marianne Lettieri juxtapose their independent art installations to create a space for poetic reverie. Working with re-purposed materials, needle, thread, light and shadow, they explore cultural, spiritual, and material translations of objects, symbols, and text through the aesthetics of craft and design. Cunningham retells an ancient creation story in imaginary tapestry, transforming garments through painterly stitches and skillful embellishment. Lettieri re-contextualizes a thousand articles of estate crochet to make a new narrative about individual identity, community, and creativity.
